## CHURCH IN THE HILLS PC (USA)

May is a very important month. For those who live in Northern Michigan, May is the month of victory. Winter and death have been defeated and life starts winning all around us. May is also Mother's Day and Pentecost. Mother's Day is well placed in May because the earth seems to be giving birth to new life all around us. That life needs cultivated, nurtured, and celebrated which sounds like what Mother's Day is all about (I hope you don't mind the stereotype). Pentecost is also celebrating new life through God's Spirit. It was originally a Jewish celebration of thankfulness for the Spring harvest of first fruits. I like to compare Pentecost to the Asparagus Festival in Empire Michigan. It celebrates one of our "first fruits" harvested early in the growing season. This celebration is important because God's faithfulness is demonstrated through the first harvest after Winter. If Winter symbolizes death and scarcity, then the "first fruit" represents God's faithfulness to give life after death.

Pentecost also became associated with the coming of the Holy Spirit because the disciples received the Holy Spirit on that day. God knew what he was doing when he made that day special. God poured out the Spirit on the day of celebration of "First Fruits." The Holy Spirit is the first fruit after death, the death of Jesus. It's God's way of demonstrating his faithfulness after the disciples had watched their rabbi and lord be beaten and crucified. Death seemed to have won the victory but then Jesus was resurrected. He showed himself to the disciples and they were overjoyed and perplexed. No one understood how this could happen and what it meant for faith. It wasn't until Pentecost that Jesus' resurrection made sense.

At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of Jesus, was poured out upon all flesh. Jesus' death and resurrection was now understood as complete victory over death. Believers could be filled with the same Spirit that filled Jesus and could continue His work and mission. Because the Spirit was available to all flesh, the believers could share the good news of Jesus without fear. They knew God was with them and that God was faithful to bring life and even life after death.

May is a big month. Victory has been won. Life wins. Love wins. Death has been defeated. Now we are free to live according to the Spirit of God. Thank you, God! for the first fruit of your Spirit.

Preliminary planning for church expenses (\$6 K) and Ramages' sabbatical expenses (\$24 K) total roughly \$30 K.
